

# BAYFIELD STREET, ROSNY PARK

## Temporary Street Furniture Guide

The purpose of this Guide is to provide guidance on the style, materiality and aesthetics of temporary furniture to be used by businesses in Bayfield Street, Rosny Park. Adherence to the Guide will ensure that the public and private streetscape areas of Bayfield Street are cohesive and unified in design and reinforce the urban character of the area. Councils vision is for the public footpath and street zones to merge seamlessly with the private forecourt areas of adjacent businesses.

This Guide is to be read in conjunction with Councils *'Temporary Furniture, Signage and Structures in Public Places Policy and Guidelines'* (April, 2006) which regulate the temporary placement by businesses and property owners of portable furniture, fixtures and signage.

Temporary street furniture includes but is not limited to cafe tables and seats, benches, signage boards, screens, umbrellas, lighting and heating. Placement of outdoor planter boxes or pots is not permitted.

### General Furniture Guidelines

- All furniture must be an outdoor design style and appropriate for outdoor use. Furniture should be easily stacked and moveable.
- Design and style of items should be uniform with only one shape and colour of each permitted. Mismatched furniture is not permitted.
- The frame structure of all furniture is to be constructed from metal or timber. Plastic framed furniture will not be accepted.
- Design and materials should consider resistance to wind gusts.
- Rubber pads must be placed on legs and bases of all furniture to prevent damage to pavement surfaces.
- No advertising is permitted to be displayed on furniture items.
- All furniture must be placed and arranged in adherence to the setbacks outlined in Councils *'Temporary Furniture, Signage and Structures in Public Places Policy and Guidelines'* (April, 2006).
- All furniture should be accessible to users of all abilities.

### Material and Finishes Guidelines

Furniture must be constructed of durable materials that do not deteriorate in outdoor conditions.

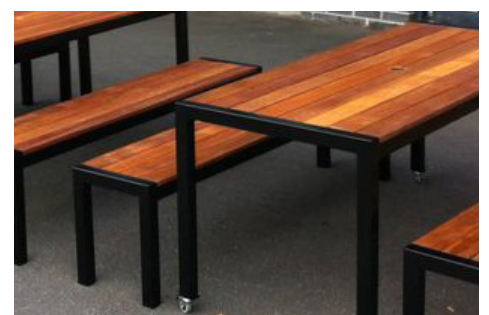
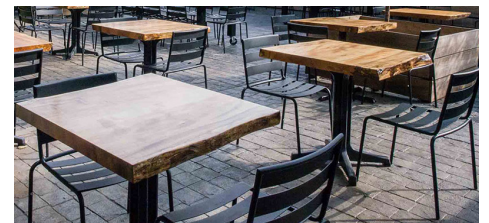
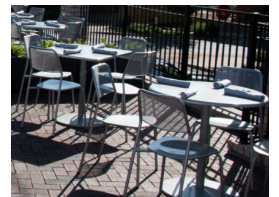
Acceptable materials:

- Timber: with suitable natural stain or oil treatment.
- Steel: preference for brushed or polished stainless steel, or powder coated finish.
- Aluminium: preference for polished or powder coated finish.
- Plastic: preference for neutral colours such as black or grey. (Plastic is not acceptable as a frame material for furniture).
- Synthetic wicker in neutral colours such as brown and black.
